Friday, August 2nd

1pm	Cycle NC Campsites open at Konehete Park (outdoor camping and RV camping) and at Rock Gym (indoor camping) – At 1 p.m. you may begin setting up your camping area (outdoor, indoor and RV) in the designated areas only once you have checked in. Access (parking, camping, etc.) is not permitted until 1 p.m. on Friday, August 2, so please DO NOT arrive before 1 p.m. As a reminder, you must be checked-in and wearing your Cycle NC wristband prior to setting up your camping area.
1pm-5pm	Cycle NC Rider Services and Check-in Open Check-in opens at the Cycle NC Rider Services located at the Rock Gym (699 Connahetta St, Murphy NC). Check- in and Rider Services will be open from 1pm to 5pm. You will receive your event wristband that must be worn at all times during the weekend. You will also receive your official ride t-shirt. Cycle North Carolina merchandise will be available for purchase.
1pm-5pm	Local Welcome Booth Open The local welcome booth will provide participants with local information, area maps, restaurant information, weekend activities and local discounts. Stop by the local welcome booth to get information about what the Murphy and Cherokee County area has to offer when you are not riding.

Tune Up Route Option Available

Warm up your legs for the weekend on this scenic 16-mile route that takes you out into the rolling valleys, including some short climbs out of the valley and then back down into Murphy and Konehete Veterans Park again. SAG support will not be available.

5pm-8pm Art Walk in Downtown Murphy

Please enjoy shopping, dining and art in Downtown Murphy as businesses stay open late and the sidewalks are filled with art vendors and music!

5pm-6:30pm Cycle NC Welcome at the L&N Depot!

Join the Cycle NC staff and town representatives at the remodeled train depot just off the Murphy River Walk! You can reach the depot in your car, but we encourage you to take the local shuttle OR walk/ride your bike on the greenway! It is only a mile and a half from the campsite on the Riverwalk. The welcome event will include free New Belgium Brewing Company beer as well as brews from other excellent local craft

breweries, hand-held snacks provided by multiple Downtown Murphy restaurants and live music from Wyatt Espalin (<u>https://wyattespalinmusic.com/</u>). Come and enjoy the first night of the Mountain Ride! *Beer and snacks available while supplies last.

Local Shuttle Info: Head to the entrance of Konehete Park to hop on a shuttle that will take you downtown and around to other parts of town. Shuttles will run from 1pm to 8pm and pick up at the park entrance approximately 15 minutes after the hour and 45 minutes after the hour.

You will receive your event wristband that must be worn at all times during the weekend when you check-in. You will also receive your official ride t-shirt. 7:30am-10am Local Welcome Booth Open The local welcome booth will provide participants with local information, area maps, restaurant information, weekend activities and local discounts. Stop by the local welcome booth to get information about what the Murphy and Cherokee County area has to offer when you are not riding. 7:30am-3pm **Cycle NC Routes Open** All routes are open 7:30am-3pm and begin and end at Konehete Park. Rest Stops include: Peachtree Community Center Enjoy a respite inside the Peachtree Community Center. This rest stop is on all three routes today and will provide some shade inside the center. Peachtree is a small unincorporated community that got its name from all of the peach trees in the area.



The Hayesville Town Square and Beal Center

Known as the "Heart of Hayesville," the circa 1888 Historic Clay County Courthouse, was saved and carefully restored by CCCRA. Rededicated in July 2018 as the Beal Center, the icon of Hayesville/Clay County, owned by the Town of Hayesville, is now operated by CCCRA as a unique community and event venue. Nantahala Lake Boat Ramp

Located in the Nantahala National Forest at an elevation of 3,012 feet, Nantahala Lake is the second highest lake east of the Mississippi. The lake now covers what was once the town of Aquone, a stagecoach stop between Asheville and Murphy. With 29 miles of shoreline, the lake offers recreational opportunities that include swimming, boating and skiing.
